The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, New Orleans District, is continuing its series of public meetings to discuss development of the Greater New Orleans Hurricane and Storm Damage Risk Reduction System.

What: Corps project managers will provide an update on the status of construction projects along the length of the Algiers Canal in Orleans and Plaquemines parishes. The meeting will focus on the anticipated construction impacts of building gates at the entrance and exit of the Belle Chasse Tunnel. The purpose of the gates is to reduce risk of a storm surge event that has a one percent chance of occurring each year. Construction of these risk reduction features are described in Individual Environmental Report 12, available on www.nolaenvironmental.gov.

Why: Construction of these risk reduction features will generate traffic impacts that may impact residents.
